Chitwan National Park's Flora and Fauna:

Biodiversity Chitwan National Park stands as Nepal's first national park, showcasing a rich variety of native flora and fauna. Located in the lowland region of the Chitwan District, it was established in 1973 under the name Royal Chitwan National Park and was later recognized as a World Heritage Site in 1984. The park covers an area of 952.63 square kilometers (367.81 square miles) and features elevations that range from 100 meters to 815 meters. Among its notable wildlife, the park is home to 68 species of mammals, 544 species of birds, 56 species of herpetofauna, and 126 species of fish. It is particularly celebrated for its conservation initiatives aimed at protecting the One-Horned Rhinoceros, Royal Bengal Tiger, and Gharial Crocodile. The park is rich in vegetation, with Sal trees predominating the southern slopes of Churia Hill, complemented by Chir Pine. The northern slopes feature Sal trees alongside smaller tree and shrub species such as Beleric, rosewood, axe-wood, elephant apple, grey downy balsam, and climbing plants like Bauhinia vahilli and Spatholobus. Approximately 20% of the park's territory is occupied by Terai-Duar Savanna and grasslands, which support over 50 species, including tall grasses such as Saccharum Ravenna (elephant grass), giant cane, Khagra reed, and various true grass species. The diverse plant life in Chitwan National Park creates a habitat for more than 700 wildlife species, along with an indeterminate number of butterflies, moths, and insects. In addition to the King Cobra and rock python, the park hosts 17 other snake species, starred tortoises, monitor lizards, 113 documented fish species, and mugger crocodiles. Among the 68 mammal species found in the park are Bengal tigers, Indian leopards, sloth bears, Bengal foxes, spotted linsangs, honey badgers, Indian jackals, fishing cats, jungle cats, Indian rhinoceroses, various deer species, flying squirrels, and more. Chitwan National Park is an intriguing destination for bird watchers and conservationists alike.

Chitwan Safari Tour Best Season:

The Chitwan safari tour presents an excellent opportunity for exploration throughout the year, attributed to its advantageous location and lower altitude. Nevertheless, it is advisable to plan your visit to Chitwan between late September and May to steer clear of the intense monsoon rains that typically occur from mid-June to mid-August, during which Nepal receives approximately 80 percent of its annual precipitation. For optimal temperatures around 30°C, the ideal visiting period is from October to early March. If you can manage the heat, April and May are particularly favorable as they signify the conclusion of the dry season, attracting wildlife to waterholes. Be prepared for extremely high temperatures, reaching the mid-43°C range during this time. January is noted as the coldest month, with nighttime temperatures nearing freezing. Although humidity levels rise from late November until the onset of the monsoon, the months of November, December, and January provide remarkable visibility and unobstructed views of the stunning Himalayas. Conversely, at other times, visibility may be compromised due to haze and pollution



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stemming from traffic, industrial activities, brick kilns, and waste incineration. In summary, the Chitwan safari tour guarantees a memorable experience, and selecting the appropriate time for your visit will enhance your adventure.

How to go to Chitwan National Park?

There are multiple modes of transportation available to access Chitwan National Park, including buses, cars, and flights from various cities such as Kathmandu, Bandipur, Pokhara, and Lumbini. Flights can be taken from both Kathmandu and Pokhara, while road travel is an option for other regions of Nepal. A highly recommended experience in Chitwan is the Jungle Safari tour, which allows visitors to discover the rich biodiversity of the area. Today we will have breakfast and move for bird watching. Then we will go for a canoe trip in the Rapti river. We will watch crocodiles and several birds in that area. We will also visit the elephant breeding farm and enjoy the elephant bath. Then we will take an elephant ride and see the observation tower. After that, we will move towards a one-horned rhino and tiger hunting tour.

- 9 am Canoe trip in Rapti river(watch the crocodiles, Gharials and birds).
- 10 am Elephant bath and visit to Elephant breeding farm.
- 11-30 am- Elephant ride and a visit to the observation tower.
- 1-30 pm lunch.
- 3 pm visit to one-horned rhino and tiger hunting area.
- 7 pm Dinner
