Because these flights are weather-dependent, they normally take place in the early morning hours, so we will book a taxi and then head to the required destination. This experience provides an amazing view of the Annapurna range and a few lakes, which lasts up to 45 minutes to an hour. After our short trip, we will then book a taxi back to your respective hotel, marking the end of this tour.

1. Is hot-air ballooning in Pokhara safe?

Yes, hot-air ballooning in Pokhara is considered safe. Flights are operated by experienced, licensed pilots using certified equipment, and flights only operate in suitable weather conditions. Pre-flight briefings and safety checks are part of the experience to ensure a secure journey.

2. How much does a hot-air balloon ride cost in Pokhara?

Prices typically range from USD 100 to USD 150 per person, depending on the season and whether you book a shared or private flight. Prices may include hotel transfers and a short celebratory refreshment after landing. Check with Trek Mania Nepal for the best package options.

3. Can children or elderly people go on a hot-air balloon ride?

Yes, children above the age of 5 years and elderly travelers in normal health condition can join the ride. However, people with heart conditions, recent surgeries, or extreme fear of heights are generally advised to consult a physician before booking.

4. What should I wear for a hot-air balloon ride in Pokhara?

Since flights take place early in the morning when it's cooler, it's best to wear layered clothing, closed-toe shoes, and a light jacket. A hat or cap is also recommended, as the heat from the burner above can be felt during the flight.

5. Is photography allowed during the balloon ride?

Absolutely. Photography and videography are not only allowed but highly encouraged. The aerial views of the Annapurna range, Machhapuchhre, Phewa Lake, and the lush Pokhara Valley provide incredible photo opportunities, especially during sunrise.

6. Do you get a certificate or souvenir after the balloon ride?

Yes, most operators offer a flight certificate as a memory of your adventure. Some may even provide a small souvenir or a toast celebration after landing. Ask while booking to know what's included in your package.

7. Where does the balloon land and how do we return?

Landing spots vary depending on the wind direction on the day of the flight. After landing, a chase vehicle will be there to pick you up and drive you back to your hotel or the meeting point.
