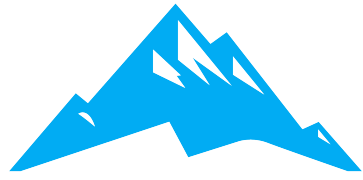

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ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Arrival in Kathmandu (1,300m/4,264ft)

Your Everest View Trek adventure begins in Kathmandu, Nepal's vibrant capital city. Immerse yourself in the city's rich cultural tapestry by exploring ancient temples like Swayambhunath (Monkey Temple) and Boudhanath Stupa, both [UNESCO World Heritage Sites](#). Wander through bustling bazaars overflowing with local handicrafts and savor traditional Nepali cuisine like momos (steamed dumplings). In the afternoon, you might choose to visit the historical Durbar Squares, architectural marvels showcasing the artistic legacy of Nepal's former kingdoms. Overnight in Kathmandu.

Day 2: Kathmandu - Ramechhap to Lukla (2,840m/9,318ft) - Phakding (2,610m/8,563ft)

In the peak season, there is a flight available from Ramechhap to Lukla. The journey from Kathmandu to Ramechhap takes approximately 5 hours by road, where you will need to catch a bus from Thamel around 1.30am. You will reach at Ramechhap airport by 6.30am and then proceed to wait for your flight to Lukla. However, during off-peak times, you have the option to fly directly from Kathmandu airport to Lukla.

Embark on a thrilling scenic flight from Kathmandu to Lukla, a gateway town nestled amidst dramatic Himalayan cliffs. As your plane takes off, witness the sprawling cityscape of Kathmandu transform into a tapestry of verdant valleys and snow-capped peaks.

Upon arrival in Lukla, often referred to as the "Gateway to Everest," breathe in the crisp mountain air and soak in the unique atmosphere of this Sherpa town. The trek begins, following a well-established trail alongside the Dudh Kosi River, offering glimpses of traditional Sherpa villages adorned with colorful prayer flags. Cross suspension bridges over cascading waterfalls and encounter the warmth and hospitality of the local people. Reach Phakding, a charming village nestled amidst pine forests, where you'll spend the night.

Day 3: Phakding - Namche Bazaar (3,440m/11,286ft)

The trail continues along the Dudh Kosi River valley, gradually ascending through diverse landscapes. Keep your eyes peeled for wildlife sightings, including Himalayan Tahr (wild goats) and colorful birds soaring above. The route offers stunning views of the surrounding peaks, including Thamserku and Kusum Kanguru.

As you ascend, you'll feel the crisp mountain air invigorate you. Finally, arrive at Namche Bazaar, a bustling trading hub known as the "Gateway to Everest." Nicknamed "Sherpa Disneyland," Namche Bazaar is a vibrant town with shops, cafes, and a local bakery. Explore the vibrant Saturday market, where you can find unique souvenirs and interact with the Sherpa people. Acclimatize to the higher altitude in Namche Bazaar, enjoying panoramic mountain views from vantage points like the Everest View Hotel. Overnight stay in Namche Bazaar.

Day 4: Acclimatization Day in Namche Bazaar

Dedicate this day to acclimatization in Namche Bazaar, allowing your body to adjust to the higher altitude. Explore the town's unique shops, cafes, and bakeries, savoring local delicacies and interacting with the Sherpa community.

Hike up to the Everest View Hotel (3,880m/12,730ft) for breathtaking sunrises and unparalleled views of Everest, Lhotse, and Ama Dablam. This short hike is an excellent way to further acclimatize for the higher altitude sections of the trek. In the afternoon, visit the Namche Bazaar Monastery, a historic Buddhist Gumpa offering a glimpse into the spiritual life of the Sherpa people. Overnight stay in Namche Bazaar.

Day 5: Namche Bazaar - Tengboche (3,867m/12,687ft)

The trail winds its way through rhododendron forests, offering vibrant bursts of color during spring. Adorned with colorful prayer flags fluttering in the breeze, the path gradually ascends towards Tengboche. Keep an eye out for diverse flora and fauna, including rare birds like the Himalayan Monal and musk deer camouflaged amongst the vegetation. As you ascend, the air thins, and the majestic Himalayan giants begin to dominate the landscape. Finally, reach Tengboche, a picturesque village perched on a hilltop at an elevation of 3,867 meters (12,687 feet).

Tengboche is renowned for its magnificent Tengboche Monastery, perched dramatically on a ridge overlooking the valley. This historic monastery, also known as the Monastery of Deboche, is the highest monastery in the Khumbu region and offers a glimpse into the vibrant Buddhist culture of the Sherpa people. Explore the monastery's courtyards adorned with prayer wheels and colorful prayer flags. Inside the main hall, witness intricate Buddhist murals, statues, and sacred artifacts. From the vantage point of Tengboche, be mesmerized by breathtaking panoramic views of Everest, Lhotse, Ama Dablam, and the surrounding peaks. Enjoy the serenity and spiritual atmosphere of Tengboche as you spend the night in a comfortable lodge.

Day 6: Tengboche - Dingboche (4,360m/14,304ft)

The trail continues its ascent, offering breathtaking views of the Himalayas with every step. Traverse through serene alpine meadows dotted with colorful wildflowers (during spring) and witness the raw beauty of the high mountain environment. The landscape transforms into a dramatic realm dominated by snow-capped peaks and glaciers. As you ascend, the importance of proper hydration and acclimatization becomes even more crucial.

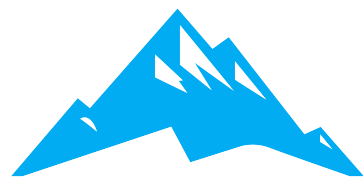

Finally, arrive back in Lukla, a fitting conclusion to your successful Everest View Trek. Celebrate your accomplishments and enjoy the warm hospitality of the Sherpa people in Lukla. Overnight stay in Lukla.

Day 8: Lukla - Kathmandu (Flight)
