It is a remarkable example of Newar architecture and holds immense cultural and religious significance in Nepal.

Additionally, you can also explore Asan Bazaar, one of the oldest and busiest marketplaces in Kathmandu. Additionally, you will be treated to a mesmerizing view of the entire Kathmandu Valley and the [Shivapuri National Park](#).

Day 3: Nagarkot to Kathmandu (Changu Narayan, Bhaktapur and Patan Durbar Square)

After having breakfast, you can head to **Changu Narayan**.

Changu Narayan Temple, located near Kathmandu, UNESCO World Heritage Site. The journey from Kathmandu to

Changu Narayan typically takes around an hour by car, taking into account factors such as traffic and road conditions. 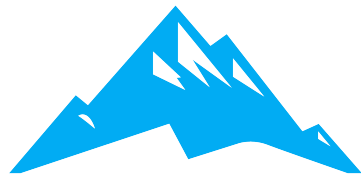
7. What should I pack for this tour?
