From your vantage point in the helicopter, you can enjoy a bird's-eye view of [Langtang National Park](#)—home to diverse flora and fauna—including the red panda, snow leopard, and a variety of bird species. These rare and endangered species make the region a paradise for wildlife enthusiasts.

Gosaikunda Lake: A Sacred Jewel in the Mountains

One of the primary attractions of the Langtang Helicopter Tour is the visit to Gosaikunda Lake, a sacred Hindu pilgrimage site located at an altitude of 4,380 meters. The lake is surrounded by snow-capped peaks and is an important site for Tamang people, who believe the lake is the home of Hindu gods. Thousands of devotees visit Gosaikunda each year during the [Janai Purnima festival](#) to bathe in its sacred waters.

The lake is composed of 108 smaller lakes, and its frozen surface during the winter months makes it one of the most striking natural landscapes in Nepal. The turquoise blue waters and stunning Himalayan backdrop provide fantastic photo opportunities for travelers and photographers alike.

During your flight, you will get to enjoy aerial views of the lakes, taking in the stark beauty of the frozen waters in winter and the vibrant, life-filled surroundings when it melts. The mesmerizing landscape of Gosaikunda is a highlight that many visitors describe as one of the most beautiful sights they've ever seen. Kyanjin Gumpa and Tibetan Buddhism

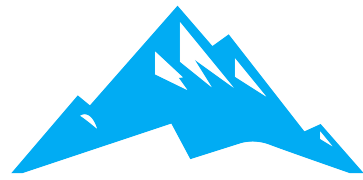

ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Airport Pickup & Kathmandu Sightseeing

One of our representatives will be waiting for pickup at the airport. S/He will welcome you in a traditional Nepali style: with a fresh garland and red vermillion. Then, through the winding alleys of Kathmandu, s/he will accompany you to your hotel. Take a rest for about 2 hours and then, we will go sightseeing.

Depending on the time of your arrival, we will try to explore at least 4 UNESCO-listed World Heritage Sites in Kathmandu. Patan Durbar Square, the 1st place we visit, is the remarkable architectural marvel garnished by the delicate sculptures and carvings of ancient Nepal. The other structures such as Pashupatinath Temple (a 17th-century temple, with over 500 shrines established within its vicinity), Boudhanath Stupa (one of the recognized unique structure stupas in the world), and Swayambhunath Temple (the 8th-century structure, believed to have self-incarnated) constitute a crucial part of the sightseeing. Kathmandu is a beautiful introduction to Nepal.

Day 2: Flight to Langtang Kyangjin Gumpa and Gosaikunda Lake

Early in the morning, we will catch a brief flight to Kyangjin Gumpa, a classic-styled Buddhist monastery. After exploring the interior and exterior décor of this monastery, we will walk towards the phenomenal village of the Tamang people. Through the narrow and bizarre-looking mountain trails, we will then fly towards the Gosaikunda Lake system to enjoy the beauty of this region. On a clear day, Ganesh Himal offers an extra shine to this region. On the way back, we will have traditional lunch with the local people and then, return back to Kathmandu from the same flight.

Day 3: Traditional Nepali feast with the travel team & Departure

With the overall travel team, you will enjoy the traditional Nepali feast in the morning. We may as well shift this program to Day 2, depending on your choice. Then, we will explore the markets of Thamel and then, escort you to the airport for departure.

If you wish to extend your stay and explore other packages, we are ready to plan some special trips for you.

FAQ

1. How long is the Langtang Helicopter Tour?

The Langtang Helicopter Tour typically takes around 2 to 3 hours, including flight time, ground time at Kyanjin Gumpa, and photo breaks.

2. Is prior trekking experience needed for this tour?

No, trekking experience is not required. The Langtang Helicopter Tour is perfect for all age groups and fitness levels, especially those who want to explore the Himalayas without trekking.

3. What is the maximum altitude we reach during the tour?

The helicopter flies up to approximately 3,800 meters when landing at Kyanjin Gumpa. It also passes near higher elevations, offering close-up views of the Langtang peaks and Gosaikunda Lake.

4. When is the best time to take the Langtang Heli Tour?

The best seasons are spring (March to May) and autumn (September to November) when the skies are clear, and mountain visibility is excellent.

5. Is it possible to combine Langtang with other helicopter tours?

Yes, we also organize helicopter tours to Everest Base Camp, Annapurna Base Camp, and Muktinath, which can be arranged as combined packages or separate adventures.

6. Are there any health risks due to altitude?

While the Langtang Heli Tour doesn't stay long at high altitudes, individuals with altitude sensitivity should consult their doctor. The short landing time minimizes the risk of altitude sickness.

7. How many people can fly in one helicopter?

Typically, 4 to 5 passengers (excluding the pilot) can fly per helicopter depending on total weight and weather conditions.
